

Exercising one's rights related to personal data in the Norwegian Quality Register for Pain Management

I have read the information from the National Quality Registry for Pain Management (SmerteReg) and want to exercise my rights regarding personally identifiable health information in the Registry.

I would like to:

- I reserve myself against my personal data being stored in the National Quality Register for Pain Management (SmerteReg). I am aware that personal data about me in the future will not be stored in SmerteReg. I am also aware that any information already stored will be deleted and that deleted information will not be recoverable.
- I wish to rescind my reservation against my personal data being stored in the National Quality Register for Pain Management (SmerteReg)

The documentation obligation, and public law obligations in particular As a public agency, the Helse Bergen Hospital Trust is subject to documentation requirements, including the duty to keep records and archives. Correspondence with the hospital will be stored as long as this is necessary to comply with relevant laws and regulations.

In order for the Helse Bergen Hospital Trust to be able to safeguard the registered persons' statutory right to be forgotten, the enterprise must process information about how to reserve oneself against having data stored. This information will not be used for purposes other than to safeguard the right to be forgotten (reservation).
